HACC-PYP LINKAGES PACKAGES PROGRAM

The Linkages Packages Program is available for people aged under 65 and Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people aged under 50, who have complex care needs and would benefit from case management support.

ELIGIBILITY

You may be eligible for Linkages if you require assistance due to physical and or psychosocial functional impairment related to disability, chronic illness or short-term health needs, and may benefit from assistance with daily activities.

HOW CAN LINKAGES PACKAGES HELP ME?

The help you receive might include personal care, dressing, preparing meals, house cleaning, property maintenance, community access, or using public transport.

A Linkages case manager will assist you to access a range of supports based on your goals, aspirations and needs to improve or maintain your capacity to remain living independently in the community, and may include assistance with services and supports, such as:

- ✓ Links to supports, services and activities within your community.
- ✓ Domestic help
- ✓ Personal care
- ✓ Nursing
- ✓ Allied Health (podiatry, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology and more)
- ✓ Respite and transport services provided by volunteers.
- ✓ Assisting you to transition to the NDIS or My Aged Care supports
